The Kappa Scholarship Endowment Fund, Incorporated (KSEF) was incorporated in the State of Virginia on March 8, 1990 as a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt non-profit entity. Its stated purpose and goals are to promote the general welfare and development of today's youth by providing educational opportunities in the form of scholarships, loans and other financial aid to deserving high school students from the Northern Virginia area. Scholarship recipients are awarded \$6,000 stipends, allocated in four \$1,500 allotments disbursed over a four-year enrollment period. The corporation is governed by its Bylaws (adopted in May 1990), and the laws of the state of Virginia.

The Kappa Scholarship Endowment Fund monitors all scholars throughout their college years and assists with career counseling, job placement assistance and mentoring encouragement. Our scholars are accepted into accredited colleges and universities nationwide, and we are proud to boast a 90% graduation rate among our scholarship recipients. The major source of KSEF's funding is provided from private donations, donations from the Combined Federal Campaign, and from various corporate grants.

### **GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

The goals and objectives of KSEF are:

- ◆ Provide deserving high school students with an opportunity to achieve academic success at an institution of higher learning.
- ◆ Provide opportunities to attain the skills and knowledge required to compete in today's world.
- ◆ Provide opportunities to strengthen our community economically, culturally and politically.
- ◆ Provide deserving students the best opportunity to succeed and to become productive members of society.

**HISTORICAL SCHOLARSHIP PROFILES**

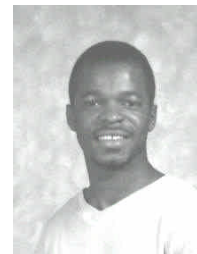
